There will be a series of Services:—On August 4th, Tuesday, at 11.30 a.m., and in the Evening at 7; August 5th, Wednesday, at 9 and 11 a.m., and at 7 p.m.; August 9th, Sunday, at 10.30 a.m., at 3 and 6.30 p.m.

The several Offertories will be devoted to the deficiency of about £1000 on an outlay of nearly £8000.

After the Consecration Service, with Sermon by the LORD BISHOP OF THE DIOCESE, and Holy Communion, on 4th August, there will be a LUNCHEON in the SUBSCRIPTION ROOMS, at which it is hoped the LORD BISHOP will preside.—Tickets 3/- each, (including wine,) may be obtained at Mr. Clark's, Mr. Evans's and Mr. Elliott's, Booksellers, Stroud.

On the 5th of August, Wednesday, at three o'clock in the Afternoon, there will be a DINNER at the SUBSCRIPTION ROOMS, (Tickets 2/6 each,) at which it is proposed to entertain, gratuitously, a number of our aged poor Parishioners. The LORD BISHOP OF PERTH will preside.

TUESDAY, AUGUST 4th.—The Consecration Service will commence at 11.30 a.m. The Sermon will be preached by the Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, and will be followed by Holy Communion. Evening Divine Service at 7; Sermon by the Rev. A. G. Cornwall, Rector of Beverstone, and Chaplain to the Queen.

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 5th.—Holy Communion at 9 a.m. At 11, Morning Prayers; Sermon by the Lord Bishop of Perth. In the Evening, at 7, Divine Service; Sermon by the Rev. J. N. Green-Armytage, M.A., Rector of Flax Bourton.

SUNDAY, AUGUST 9th.—Morning Service at 10.30; Sermon by the Rev. John James Barlow, M.A., Vicar of Kempsford. Holy Communion.—Afternoon Service at 3.0; Sermon by the Very Rev. the Dean of Stamford. Evening Service at 6.30; Sermon by the Ven. Sir George Prevost, Bart., Archdeacon of Gloucester.

Collections will be made at all the Services: in the Morning, during the reading of the Offertory sentences. After the prayer for the Church militant, there will be a pause to enable non-communicants to leave the Church.

Admission to the Consecration Service on Tuesday Morning will be by Ticket only, to be obtained of the Ministers and Churchwardens.
